Judging a Building by the Cover

A magnificent painting of a door to a home in Venice, Italy hangs on the wall of our kitchen. The door, which is painted blue, is the entryway to this Venetian home set atop a staircase that rises directly from a canal. The door is framed by shuddered windows which are adorned with bright fuchsia flowers.

Over the years, this painting has been the source of countless hours of musing while I eat, and as I gaze upon the blue door, my imagination soars. Who lives in this regal estate? Are the owners Jewish? Is this romantic entrance on the waterway the only access in and out of the home? What might it be like to live there?

While it may be impossible to actually know the answers to these questions based on the painting alone, there are many clues that may be gathered in a glance. For instance, the blue door might suggest that, at some point in time, the home was owned by Sephardic Jews (who often paint their doors blue to ward off the evil eye), but the fact that there is no mezuzah on the doorpost suggests that the current owners are not likely Jewish. The fact that each window is beautifully adorned with fuchsia flowers suggests that the owners have an affinity for natural beauty, and the fact that the outside of the home is meticulous in every way, suggests that the inside is likely magnificent as well.

My daily musings over this painting reminds me of the fact that we draw conclusions all the time from what we observe. It's simply part of human nature. Our assessments are often quite quick, and based on what we see in an instant, we can draw many conclusions regarding the places we go and the people we meet.

What conclusions do visitors draw from their first experiences at HCRJ? From our simple, modern building with understated beauty, people often say that, for years, they have driven by without noticing that our building was a synagogue. However, upon entering our facility, most people find it inviting, intimate, warm and *heimish* (a Yiddish term for a feeling found in a loving home).

For decades, HCRJ has prided itself in these qualities as we have long viewed people as our most valued assets. Central to our identity has been the idea that we are open to all who enter our house of worship, and central to our philosophy has been a mindset of inclusiveness.

After the tragedy which took place at Tree of Life synagogue in Pittsburgh, the ways in which we understand ourselves as a congregation is being challenged, and in response to our newfound sense of vulnerability, we are seeking ways to balance our values of warmth and openness with our need to bolster security.

Sadly, in this post-Pittsburgh reality, our values associated with first impressions need to be reconsidered. As Jews, our priorities concerning the beauty of our gathering places must now include concerns for safety. Where we once placed a premium on spaces designed to nurture a sense of community, we must now seek to erect barriers to maximize security. Where we once maintained policies which kept doors open to all, we must now erect barricades which greet strangers with suspicion.

This is the world in which we now live, and yet while we may seek to deter those who may glance at our building with eyes searching to do harm, we also need to be steadfast in our efforts to remain warm and welcoming. Our staff and our board are taking these challenges very seriously. We have been meeting with law enforcement and special security services to increase our preparedness and protection, and we are working on ways to ensure that the image we present to the outer world is one that deters all people with ill intent.

Like the painting on my kitchen wall, our edifice must also tell a story. As a picture is worth a thousand words, we hope our building can tell evil doers to stay away, while we continue to welcome all who wish to share in the sacred, beauty offered within our walls.






